CC&Rs and Starting a Project

Whether trimming trees, landscaping or building a deck, don't forget to check our Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions and have your project approved by our Architectural Control Committee. We all accepted the CCRs simply by purchasing or renting a home in this neighborhood and they guide what can and cannot be done on and around each property in the neighborhood so as to maintain the beauty and character and value of our homes.

Every resident is urged to become familiar with the CC&Rs (see our web site) and courteously respect these agreements.

Thanks for being a good neighbor by reading this newsletter, getting familiar with our CC&Rs, and taking an active part in your HOA. Having a quiet, attractive, and desirable neighborhood is a joint effort in which we all have a part.

Spring Cleaning

We know clean-up around our HOA is a mutual year-round effort, but spring especially calls for weeding, trimming, and the clearing of winter's dropped twigs and small branches around the home and adjacent common space. So grab your yard waste barrel, pack it full for each pick-up day, and help our neighborhood shine. Please be courteous and do NOT blow lawn clippings, leaves, and other debris into the street. Our streets are only cleaned twice a year.

Plants and Landscaping

Though major landscaping changes and their potential effects on common space need to be approved by the HOA, there are many planting ideas that can be implemented within the homeowners' property every season to problem-solve and beautify. Some plants and ideas for our area (see below):

Plants and Landscaping cont.

- a. Deer-resistant plants and flowers (some are evergreen) such as: Helleborus, Foxglove, Barberry, Lavender, Heuchera, many Coneflowers, 5' tall Miscanthus Variegatus and smaller ornamental grasses, many Sedges, Lilyturf, Shasta Daisy, many Sedums, Thyme, Wallflowers, many ground covers, Tassel and other ferns and the large local selection of azaleas and rhododendrons. Most of these, and many others, are also perennials which will come back every year.
- b. If your own property is slightly sloping, just a single row one-high of small rock or landscape brick across the space to even each level can provide a place to inhibit water run-off and nestle in some of these resistant ground covers or plants.
- c. Mulch or bark will keep down weeds and give a neat look to your yard.
- d. Systemic insect killers may be a major cause of bee die-off, and are not recommended for use.
- e. Note: Large shrubs should not be planted alongside our roads, as that is common space and needs to be kept clear for traffic visibility and safety.
